### **Call to Order & Introductions**

# **Executive Board and Committee Chair Reports:**

President (Erica Kelly): Present, no report

President-elect (Rainey Davis): Present. Went to Chapter Leaders mtg, learned some things about other Chapters that will share.

Past President (Tory Westall): Present, no report

Treasurer (Ryan Lopez): Not Present, sent emailed report: Balance 1 January 2021 - \$42,140.82, income between 1 January and 31 December 2021 - \$973.75, Expenses between 1 January and 21 December 2021 - \$1,957.71, Balance as of 31 December 2021 - \$41,156.86, Current Balance - \$39,857.86. The big charge this year (2022) was Whova for the 2022 NCC. -\$1,439, also had an 2022 automatic deposit of \$140 for dues.

The Chapter received a \$1,000 donation from Ms. Kevin Douglas Olsen and Mrs. Beatrice Ann Olsen (will be deposited tomorrow) for "purposes of habitat restoration". In accepting the money, the Chapter agrees "to use the grant exclusively in furtherance of your organization's tax-exempt mission". Based on the language in the letter (sent to Board on 2-9-22), Ryan thinks we do not necessarily need to use the money for "habitat restoration", however, since that is what they want, he thinks we should make an effort to use this money in this manner. Action Item: If as a group we do not have any recipients offhand, Ryan volunteers to look for something in our Chapter's area that satisfies "habitat restoration" and present it to the board for vote (hopefully more than one option). Action Item: Once we decide how to use this money, we should send them a thank you and put it in the newsletter detailing the donation.

Secretary (Julie Vance): Present, no report

Chapter Representative (Randi McCormick): If want to go to Western Section workshops, are filling quickly and are wait lists. Annual Conf next year in Riverside, not sure if hybrid or in person.

Granting Committee Chair (Lori Bono): Not Present, no report. Erica: We did provide travel grants for 3 students to attend: Brian Fagundes, Sierra Montage (virtual) and Emily Bergman were funded to attend.

## 2. BNLL Workshop in 2022

- Dr. Germano and Howard have agreed to help lead the workshop
- Action Item: We need to pick dates for the workshop and get the ball rolling on this
- Action Item: send Erica BNLL curriculum. Randi prev did survey methods/hatchling protocol. CDFW included in talks.
- Need to select date. <u>Action Item</u>: check dates in May for Dr Germano. Lecture will be online. If online only won't count towards level II like full workshop with field workshop.
- 20-25 attendees allowed in field in past.
- Potential field site Semitropic ER. Room for vehicles, etc.
- Offered to members first (for full field trip). Only 2 attendees per company. Unlimited for classroom only portion.
- Suggested pricing after discussion: \$400 for full classroom/field, lesser cost for classroom only (\$150). Some discussion about how to prove virtual attendees are participating. Tory made motion that \$400 full price for classroom/field portion. 1 dissenting vote, motion carried. Julie motioned \$150 for classroom only, \$50 for students and we have grant options for students and early career professions. Tory seconded. Motion carried.
